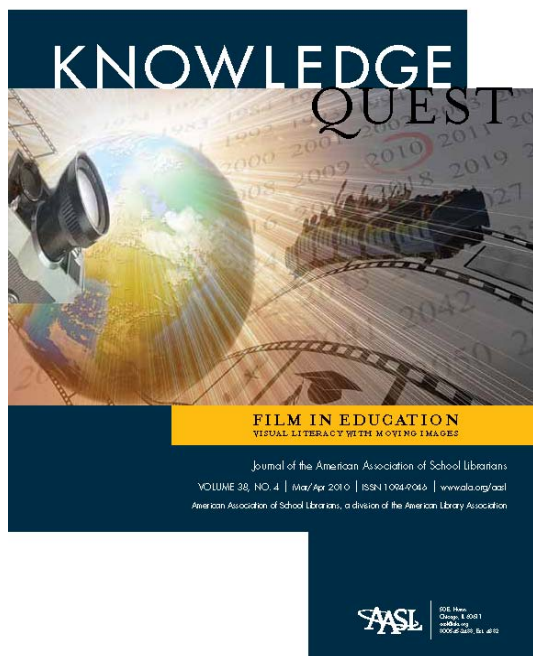


# 2010: March

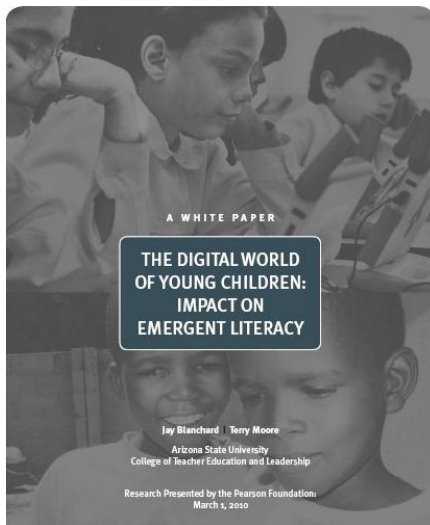
