Informational Text

Meaning and Context (MC)

Standard 5 (p 44): Determine meaning and develop logical interpretations by making predictions, inferring, drawing conclusions, analyzing, synthesizing, providing evidence, and investigating multiple interpretations.

Language, Craft, and Structure (LCS)
